Journalist and expert scribe Mike Taylor has been hugely helpful in getting ELVA words and images to various magazine editors, on this occasion prompted by the ELVA 60th ANNIVERSARY events. We recently met up with Keith Marsden, plus ELVA owners Bruce Bartell (Mk.VIIS) and Michael Birch (GT160), both cars being BMW powered, together with Gareth Burnett and John Aston at the very impressive premises of Pace Products in Suffolk. It was also good to see once again expert modeller Tim Dyke who is producing a superb one-off 1/43rd scale model of GT160 #3 for Michael in its current highly competitive racing ready condition.

The story line is the important link between ELVA and BMW; and how it happened, with the finished article due to appear in the internationally circulated publication 'BMW CAR'. As a start a few weeks earlier Mike and I went to visit 91 year old Frank Webb to talk to him about his time in association with ELVA meaning the Rytune Engineering Company Ltd, and later the Nerus Engineering Company Ltd. Frank impressed us with his recall and an understated approach to his undoubted engineering talents which in later years extended to becoming a key figure at Cosworth.

Frank Webb related his early time spent at the Rother Iron Works located in the pretty and historically important port of Rye in the southeast corner of England, the company producing all sorts of metal castings and services. As times permits the full story will be told on the ELVA website.
